Chapter 5: Automation

Section 1-509: Use of Generative Artificial Intelligence Technology and Large Language Models

A. **Definitions.** In this section the following definitions apply:

“Non-Production Use” means use of an AI tool for testing and evaluation purposes only.

B. through H. [No change]

I. **Approval of Generative AI Tools.** Approval of any Generative AI tool must use the process adopted by the administrative director. The administrative director will maintain, regularly update, and make available to courts a list of Generative AI tools that are categorized as: (1) approved for all purposes, (2) approved for public content only, (3) approved for non-production use only, or (34) prohibited. Court personnel are not permitted to use any Generative AI tool not listed unless the tool has been approved by the relevant court’s judicial leadership as set forth in K.

1. and 2. [No change]

3. Approved for Non-Production Use Only. Court personnel may use any “approved for non-production use only” Generative AI tool for investigative, testing, prototyping, or pilot purposes as approved by judicial leadership. Judicial leadership must ensure adequate security controls are in place as a prerequisite to approving any Generative AI tool for non-production use. Court personnel are prohibited from using live (production) court data that has not been redacted or anonymized in any “approved for non-production use only” Generative AI tool.

4. Prohibited. Court personnel are not permitted to use any Generative AI Tool that is categorized as “prohibited.”
