In August, 2021, the Arizona Supreme Court issued Administrative Order No. 2021-142 which authorized the use of “Digital Evidence” in the Arizona Superior Court through a digital evidence portal. All applicable definitions and provisions of that order are herein incorporated by reference.

In order to further effectuate the transition to Digital Evidence in Gila County,

IT IS ORDERED that Digital Evidence is to be used for all evidentiary hearings in all case types except jury trials.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the effective date for use of Digital Evidence in jury trials will be set upon issuance of a memorandum by the Presiding Judge.

Judges setting evidentiary hearings are encouraged to include information in hearing notice, minute entries, and orders to remind the parties that the Digital Evidence portal will be utilized.
