On December 15, 2021, the Superior Court of Arizona in Yavapai County implemented the Digital Evidence pilot project. The Digital Evidence portal, made available by the Arizona Supreme Court, provides a standard online solution for the submission, management, and storage of court case exhibits. The portal offers an efficient and electronic method for sharing exhibits among judges, attorneys, and litigants during virtual and in-person court proceedings.

Due to the successful implementation of the Digital Evidence portal in the pilot divisions, **IT IS ORDERED** expanding the Digital Evidence pilot to all divisions of the Yavapai County Superior Court, effective November 1, 2022. Court proceedings conducted in juvenile and family law cases are exempt from Digital Evidence until further Administrative Order.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED permitting the parties to continue to use physical exhibits, including documents and photos, during in-court proceedings. Parties are still required to upload all exhibits into the Digital Evidence portal. The clerk will stamp the exhibits in the portal, as those will be considered the official record of the court. The physical exhibits used during in-court proceedings will not be marked by the clerk. The parties must ensure the numbering of their in-court exhibits matches the numbering of the exhibits in the Digital Evidence portal.
