

COURT PERSONNEL

Statewide Narrative Summary

The statewide summary reflects all court positions as of June 30, 2018, including positions funded from both primary and non-primary budget sources. The information was reported by the individual courts and probation departments in response to the Supreme Court personnel survey distributed electronically in June 2018.

The total number of persons working full-time in the Arizona judicial system slightly increased by from 9,391 in FY 2017, to 9,394 in FY 2018. Part-time personnel decreased slightly by less than 1% from 998 in FY 2017 to 990 in FY 2018.

Starting in FY 2017, the Supreme Court bench, increased from 5 to 7 justices. Other notable personnel changes include 30 additional field probation officers, and 13 additional program and general full times support staff. Detention officers positions also increased from 447 to 457, and probation/detention administrative staff positions also slightly increased from 145 to 153 (5.5%). Of the total funded positions statewide, 7.5% of full time and 19.4% of part time positions were reported as vacant at the end of FY 2018. Of the part time positions, 295 or 29.8%, are classified as Other Magesterial.

The courts also had the services of 2,885 regular volunteers, a decrease from the 3,382 volunteers during FY 2017. Volunteers include attorneys, court reporters, teachers, mediators, information desk personnel, Court Appointed Special Advocates, Foster Care Review Board members, and other professionals and non-professionals who serve as on-call magistrates.

Additionally, the courts utilized 150,534 hours of temporary personnel assistance. This is equivalent to 18,817 person-days, or 72 full-time employees.

Some of the FY 2017 figures may not correspond to figures published in last year's Data Report due to corrected information received subsequent to publication of the Report. Personnel reports received from courts are checked for anomalies, but are not audited by the Supreme Court.
