

COURT PERSONNEL
Statewide Narrative Summary
Fiscal Year 2019

The statewide summary of Fiscal Year 2019 Personnel Survey reflects all court positions as of June 30, 2019, including positions funded from both primary and non-primary budget sources. The information was reported by the individual courts and probation departments in response to the Supreme Court's electronic distribution of the personnel survey in June of 2019. Of the total funded court positions in the Arizona judicial system, 91.3% of the personnel worked full-time and 8.7% worked part-time.

Full-time Positions

The total number of persons working full-time in FY 2019 was 9,245, a decrease of 1.6% from 394 in FY 2018. Deputy clerks accounted for 22.7% and field probation officers accounted for 11.1% of the full-time personnel. At the end of FY 2019, 5.7% of the court positions were reported as vacant.

Part-time Positions

Part-time personnel decreased 11.7% from 998 in FY 2018 to 881 in FY 2019. Of the part time positions, 239 or 27.1%, were classified as Other Magisterial. At the end of FY 2019, 9.3% of them were reported as vacant.

Volunteers and Temporary Personnel Assistance

The courts also had the services of 3,525 regular volunteers, an increase from 2,885 volunteers in FY 2018. The volunteers included attorneys, court reporters, teachers, mediators, information desk personnel, Court Appointed Special Advocates, Foster Care Review Board members, and other professionals and non-professionals who served as on-call magistrates.

Additionally, the courts utilized 127,891 hours of temporary personnel assistance, the equivalent of 15,986 person-days or 61 full-time employees.
