

COURT PERSONNEL
Statewide Narrative Summary
Fiscal Year 2020

The statewide summary of Fiscal Year 2020 Personnel Survey reflects all court positions as of June 30, 2020, including positions funded from both primary and non-primary budget sources. The information was reported by the individual courts and probation departments in response to the Supreme Court's electronic distribution of the personnel survey in June of 2020. Of the total funded positions in the Arizona judicial system, 91.2% of the personnel worked full-time and 8.8% worked part-time.

Full-time Positions

The total number of persons working full-time in FY 2020 was 9,011, a decrease of 2.5% from 9,245 in FY 2019. Deputy clerks accounted for 24% and field probation officers accounted for 11.1% of the full-time personnel. At the end of FY 2020, 3.1% of the court positions were reported as vacant.

Part-time Positions

Part-time personnel decreased 8.8% from 870 in FY 2019 to 887 in FY 2020. Of the part time positions, 275 or 31.6%, were classified as Other Magisterial. At the end of FY 2020, 8.3% of them were reported as vacant.

Volunteers and Temporary Personnel Assistance

The courts also had the services of 3,448 regular volunteers, a slight decrease from 3,525 volunteers in FY 2019. The volunteers included attorneys, court reporters, teachers, mediators, information desk personnel, Court Appointed Special Advocates, Foster Care Review Board members, and other professionals and non-professionals who served as on-call magistrates.

Additionally, the courts utilized 122,860 hours of temporary personnel assistance, the equivalent of 15,358 person-days or 59 full-time employees.
