I. CALL TO ORDER

A. Welcome and Opening Remarks

The May 26, 2026, meeting of the Data Standards Advisory Committee was called to order at 10:00 a.m. by Jennifer Jones, meeting chair. Jennifer welcomed members, took rollcall, established a quorum, and noted the meeting was being recorded.

B. April 28, 2026, Meeting Minutes

Jennifer Jones displayed the April 28, 2026, draft meeting minutes. Jennifer asked for a motion to approve the minutes.

Niltza Flores made a motion to approve the minutes, and Odette Apodaca seconded the motion. The committee voted and the motion passed unanimously.

C. Call to the Public

Jennifer Jones made a call to the public for comments. There was no response.

D. AOC Statistics Team – Updates from Team and Questions from Members

Richard "Rico" Rivera attended the meeting on behalf of the AOC Statistics Team and invited questions from members. No questions were raised.

E. Administrative Directive 2026-05 Modifying AD 2024-10 – Review and Discuss

Laura Ritenour presented Administrative Directive 2026-05, which amends Administrative Directive 2024-10 by extending the deadline for Appearance Reason, Event Entry, and Event Category code sets not identified in the FARE, NICS, Public Access Repository, and Protection Orders sections of the CCR Specifications. Discussion clarified that the deadline extension applies to approval of the code sets and that testing activities must still be completed prior to implementation.

II. ITEMS FROM PREVIOUS MEETINGS AND NEW ITEMS

F. Code Standardization Requests

Laura Ritenour presented the following code sets for review:

i. Mental Health Repository Code Set

Laura Ritenour presented the proposed Mental Health Repository Code Set for review and vote. Committee members discussed the code set and Maricopa County requested additional time for review. No vote was taken, and the item was tabled until the June meeting.

ii. Additional AZPOINT Codes

Laura Ritenour presented the proposed Additional AZPOINT Codes for review. The committee discussed revisions to the protective order hearing request code and associated descriptions. Members recommended modifying the “Protective Order Defendant Request for Hearing” code and description to better reflect the intended use. Additional discussion occurred regarding petition-related codes and potential modifications.

Randy Kennedy made a motion to approve the Additional AZPOINT Codes with the modifications discussed by the committee, and Laurie Allen seconded the motion. The committee voted and the motion passed unanimously.

iii. Sentence Type Code Set

Laura Ritenour presented the Sentence Type Code Set for review and vote. The committee discussed future maintenance of the code set and agreed that additional sentence types could be added through future code standardization requests as needed.

Odette Apodaca made a motion to approve the Sentence Type Code Set, and Katrina Solis seconded the motion. The committee voted and the motion passed unanimously.

iv. Appearance Reason Code Set

Laura Ritenour presented the Appearance Reason Code Set for review and vote. The committee discussed multiple hearing variations, including Civil Traffic Hearing codes with differing time intervals, as well as codes ending in “Remote” and “Telephonic.” Members recommended removing certain duplicative hearing variations and simplifying several code descriptions, including changing “Criminal Arraignment” to “Arraignment.”

Laurie Allen made a motion to approve the Appearance Reason Code Set with the modifications discussed by the committee, and Niltza Flores seconded the motion. The committee voted and the motion passed unanimously.

v. Event Category Code Set

Laura Ritenour presented the Event Category Code Set for review. Using examples from process and document-related events, the committee discussed whether event categories should remain separate from event entry types and the relationship between the two code sets. Members agreed additional review and refinement are needed. Proposed event codes will be presented with the proposed event category, and both items will be voted on together.

vi. Event Entry Type Code Set

Laura Ritenour presented the Event Entry Type Code Set for review and discussed the need for a standardized code set of generic Event Entry Type codes to support eFiling and future data exchange requirements. Laura noted the goal is to approve sections of the code set incrementally, allowing courts sufficient time to implement changes before the January deadline.

1. Laura Ritenour presented the proposed generic Event Entry Type Codes and associated Event Categories for voting. She stated the need for a standardized code set of generic Event Entry Type codes was to support eFiling and future data exchange requirements.

Summer Dalton made a motion to approve the generic Event Entry Type Codes and associated Event Categories identified on the list, and Odette Apodaca seconded the motion. The committee voted and the motion passed unanimously.

2. Laura Ritenour presented the proposed Addendum section of the Event Entry Type Code Set for voting.

Summer Dalton made a motion to approve the Addendum Event Entry Types and associated Event Categories, and Katrina Solis seconded the motion. The committee voted and the motion passed unanimously.

3. Laura Ritenour presented the proposed Acceptance section of the Event Entry Type Code Set for voting.

Niltza Flores made a motion to approve the Acceptance Event Entry Types and associated Event Categories, and Odette Apodaca seconded the motion. The committee voted and the motion passed unanimously.

4. Laura Ritenour presented the proposed Affidavit section of the Event Entry Type Code Set for voting. During discussion, members requested additional analysis regarding the proposed “Affidavit of a Person” entry type. That item was removed from the list prior to voting and will undergo further review.

Katrina Solis made a motion to approve the remaining Affidavit Event Entry Types and associated Event Categories, and Odette Apodaca seconded the motion. The committee voted and the motion passed unanimously.

5. Laura Ritenour presented the proposed Allegation section of the Event Entry Type Code Set for voting.

Odette Apodaca made a motion to approve the Allegation Event Entry Types and associated Event Categories, and Niltza Flores seconded the motion. The committee voted and the motion passed unanimously.

G. Updates, Comments and Questions from Members

There were no updates, comments, or questions from members.

Adding U for Undesignated and UN for Unclassified to the standardized Offense Class code set,
Requested by: AOC AJACS Team

Background, Summary, and Intended Use

- In CCR Specifications Version 4.1, in the Stage Case Charge feed is the ClassofOffenseCode field.
- This is a required data feed for FARE & Public Access to provide Criminal Count/charge that is associated with case & party. It also shows a tracked modification to a count/charge.
- The definition of the ClassofOffenseCode field is: “This is the Class of Offense code assigned for the charge by the Source system” and it is a required field.
- This code set was approved by the Data Standardization Advisory Committee at its June 2023 meeting and updated at the April 2025 meeting.
- At the June 2023 meeting, the committee approved UN for Undesignated and the AJACS team believes now that is incorrect and it should be a U.
- Offense class codes are also used by the AOC for statistical reports and their use on a statewide level will ensure the data is more accurate and consistent.
- This code set is used by both general and limited jurisdiction courts.
- **This proposed offense code is associated to criminal cases in superior courts only and was created in response to HB 2162 (2022) to serve as a placeholder for undesignated felonies.**

Requested Implementation Timeline

When approved, the code would be added to the AOC’s FME Data Translation Server and courts would need to transmit these codes per the CCR Integration Design Specification documentation within 90 days (October 1, 2026 if approved June 30th or November 1, 2026 if approved July 28th). This code set is part of [Administrative Directive 2024-10](#); however, we need to allow enough time for courts to make this update if needed.

Request to Standardize Appearance Reasons. Requested by Pima County, Court Services, and Mesa Municipal Court

Background, Summary, and Intended Use

- In CCR Specifications Version 4.1.4, in the Stage Hearing feed is the HearingTypeCode (aka Appearance Reason) field. The definition of the field is: “Refers to the specific reason a party or parties were scheduled to appear before the court. Submitted to CCR when the hearing is scheduled and may be updated after the hearing date with the result of the hearing.”
- Appearance Reason refers to the specific purpose a party or parties were scheduled to appear before the court. It refers to the purpose of the appearance not the fact that someone was present (“appeared”).
- This is a required field for transmission and this code set would be used by both general and limited jurisdiction courts.
- Pima County has requested the first four codes below as they have different usages from the codes in the code set approved at the May 26, 2026 meeting.
- AOC requested the modification of the Approval of Accounting Conservator Hearing from 236 to 1759 as 236 was duplicated in the code set by accident, and requested an update to the description for 468 Change of Hearing - PT to Change of Plea Hearing - PT.
- Mesa Municipal Court has requested two additional codes as well.
