Did a "court official" text to tell you a loved one is in jail and you need to arrange to pay their bail right away? That's very likely a lie! Did you get a "court document" that asks you to provide private information through e-mail? Check before you send!

Scammers come in all shapes and sizes and connect through the telephone, text messages, and e-mail. But they have a desire in common; they want your money or your personal information. Don't give it to them.

Make sure you recognize the texter, e-mail sender, or caller from previous court interactions. Or, contact the court directly to confirm such requests are legitimate using a telephone number you find on the court's website or in the phonebook - don't use a phone number or e-mail address the scammers give you.
