## Comment Sought on Arizona Child Support Guidelines

**PHOENIX** – The Arizona Supreme Court’s Child Support Guidelines Review Subcommittee seeks public feedback on the current [Child Support Guidelines](#) as part of ongoing quadrennial reviews. The Family Court (COFC) subcommittee will hold a public forum on **July 22, 2026**, to receive public comments and consider written comments submitted in advance of the meeting.

The Subcommittee is conducting its federally and state-mandated review of the Arizona Child Support Guidelines. As part of this process, the Subcommittee will evaluate economic data, labor market trends, parenting-time considerations, and other factors affecting child support determinations in Arizona. The Subcommittee must also address issues referred to it by a [report](#) from the 2021 Committee for an Interim Review of the [Child Support Guidelines](#).

The forum is intended to gather input before the review begins, which will help inform the Subcommittee’s work. Members of the public and stakeholders will have the opportunity to share their perspectives based on the current [Child Support Guidelines](#), submit written comments, and provide oral testimony to support the development of future recommendations.

Draft recommendations may be posted for public comment before being routed through the COFC other Arizona Supreme Court advisory committees, with final approval resting with the Arizona Judicial Council.

Meeting materials, registration information for speakers, and instructions for submitting written comments will be available on the Child Support Guidelines Review Webpage.
