**ORDER OF  
REINSTATEMENT  
EFFECTIVE THE SAME  
DATE OF CONDITIONS OF  
PROBATION ARE SIGNED  
AND DELIVERED TO THE  
STATE BAR OF ARIZONA**

**FILED DECEMBER 18, 2018**

On November 20, 2018, the Supreme Court granted the request of Rachel L. Yosha (“Applicant”) to extend time for her to apply for reinstatement under Rule 64(e)(2) Ariz. R. Sup. Ct.<sup>1</sup> On November 27, 2018, she applied for reinstatement pursuant to Rule 64(e)(2). (“Application”). The State Bar has ten (10) days from service to file an objection under Rule 64(e)(2)(B). No objection was filed by the State Bar and the time to object has expired.

As cited in the Application, on October 23, 2017, the hearing panel filed an Amended Decision and Order Imposing Sanctions. The hearing panel ordered Applicant suspended for ninety (90) days. She was also ordered placed “on two (2)

years of probation **effective the date of a reinstatement order**” and ordered to complete additional continuing legal education. (Emphasis in original). The Amended Decision was appealed.

On May 9, 2018, the Arizona Supreme Court affirmed the hearing panel Amended Decision and Order of suspension and a term of “2-year probation effective on the date of a reinstatement order...” As noted in the Supreme Court decision, proposed terms of supervision are existent and were created under the Membership Assistance Program “(MAP)” but were not signed by Applicant.

A term of probation begins with the entry of signed terms of probation. Upon Applicant signing those existent MAP terms as terms of probation and delivering them to the State Bar of Arizona, this Order of Reinstatement shall be effective that same date. The two-year probation period will be effective the same date as the reinstatement order.

Now Therefore,

**IT IS ORDERED** reinstating Applicant, **Rachel L. Yosha, Bar No. 011780**, to the active practice of law in Arizona effective upon her signing and filing with the State Bar of Arizona the aforementioned MAP terms of probation.
