Kevin Robinson Joins the Arizona Judicial Council

PHOENIX – Arizona Supreme Court Chief Justice Robert Brutinel issued [Administrative Order 2020-91](#) appointing Kevin Robinson, a former City of Phoenix Assistant Police Chief and current instructor at Arizona State University, to the Arizona Judicial Council (AJC). The AJC was established 30 years ago in June of 1990 to assist the supreme court and the chief justice in the development and implementation of policies and procedures for the administration of all courts in Arizona. The AJC seeks uniformity in court operations and in the coordination of court services that will improve the administration of justice in Arizona.

Mr. Robinson has been a full-time instructor in Arizona State University's School of Criminology and Criminal Justice since 2017, teaching courses on crime control policies; policing; race, ethnicity, and crime; criminology; advanced criminological theory; gender, crime, and criminal justice; and more. From 1980 until 2017, he was a member of the Phoenix Police Department, assigned to nearly every precinct and bureau, before retiring at the rank of Assistant Police Chief. Mr. Robinson is a graduate of the F.B.I. National Academy and the F.B. I. National Executive Institute.

Membership on the AJC is determined by an individual's role in the courts or by appointment of the chief justice. The AJC currently includes 25 members: The Chief Justice, 11 judges, 9 public members, two court administrators, one clerk of the superior court, and the president of the State Bar of Arizona.
