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Updated Guidance for Processing Eviction Matters During the COVID-19 Pandemic

PHOENIX – In April, the Administrative Office of the Courts (AOC) provided guidance in answering questions raised by the governor’s executive order, the Arizona Supreme Court’s Administrative Orders, and the federal CARES Act as they related to the residential eviction process during the coronavirus pandemic. In response to a more recent executive order and other changes, the AOC has updated its guidance and a form for tenants to use when notifying their landlord of a qualifying COVID-19-related circumstance.
