ORDER OF INTERIM SUSPENSION

The State Bar filed a Motion for Interim Suspension with the presiding disciplinary judge pursuant to Rule 61(c)(2), Rules of the Supreme Court. Respondent Raymond L. Miller filed a response. In his response and at the evidentiary hearing on November 9, 2012, respondent admitted that he misappropriated client funds. On November 14, 2012, the presiding disciplinary judge issued a report recommending that this Court grant the motion and issue an order of interim suspension. The report was filed in this Court pursuant to Rule 61(c)(2)(D).

Upon review of the motion, response, and report of the presiding disciplinary judge, the Court finds that the motion for interim suspension should be granted.

IT IS ORDERED, pursuant to Rule 61(c), Rules of the Supreme Court, that **Raymond L. Miller** is suspended from the practice of law, effective January 18, 2013.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that effective immediately **Raymond L. Miller** is placed on probation in order to allow the orderly disposition of his practice. Within seven (7) days of the date of

this order, the presiding disciplinary judge shall meet with the respondent and bar counsel to establish the terms and conditions of respondent's probation until the effective date of the interim suspension.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that effective immediately respondent shall not accept for representation any new clients and is precluded from distributing or transferring funds from any trust account to anyone without the prior written approval of bar counsel or as established by the presiding disciplinary judge.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the suspension shall continue in effect until final disposition of all pending proceedings against **Raymond L Miller**, unless earlier vacated or modified.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that pursuant to Rule 72(a), Rules of the Supreme Court, **Raymond L Miller** shall notify all his clients within ten days from the date of this order of the terms of this order and shall promptly inform this Court of his compliance with this Order as provided by Rule 72(e), Rules of the Supreme Court of Arizona.
