O R D E R

Applicant ANN P. WOODRICK has established to the satisfaction of the Hearing Panel that she is qualified for reinstatement to the active practice of law, except for completion of the additional requirement of Rule 64(c) of the Rules of the Supreme Court to take the Arizona Bar Exam. However, upon consideration of "Applicant's Response to Hearing Panel's Report and Recommendation; Request for Expedited Ruling," and the State Bar's response to Applicant's motion and response, pursuant to Rule 65 of the Rules of the Supreme Court,

IT IS ORDERED pursuant to Rule 26 of the Rules of the Supreme Court, and for good cause shown, that the requirement of Rule 64(c) is WAIVED.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the Hearing Panel's conclusion that it has no authority to waive the Rule 64(c) requirement itself, is AFFIRMED. However, it does retain authority under Rule 65(b)(3) to include findings of fact and a recommendation regarding waiver of the requirement when an Applicant makes such a request.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the appropriate standard for determining whether an applicant must retake the Arizona Bar Exam is good cause, rather than extraordinary circumstances.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that Applicant ANN P. WOODRICK be reinstated as an active member of the State Bar of Arizona effective the date of this Order.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that Applicant ANN P. WOODRICK shall be placed on probation for a period of up to nine months beginning on the

date of her reinstatement. Upon proof of her successful completion of the terms and conditions of her probation, and upon notification by the State Bar to the Court that the Applicant has provided the appropriate proof, Applicant's probation shall expire. The terms and conditions of probation are as follows:

1. Applicant shall provide proof that she has obtained a score of 85 or greater on the MPRE exam (a passing score for Arizona), Rule 35 (b) (6) and (7) of the Rules of the Supreme Court.
2. Applicant shall successfully complete the course on Arizona law described in Rule 34(j) of the Rules of the Supreme Court.
