Due to concern for the spread of COVID-19 in the general population, the Governor of the State of Arizona has declared a statewide emergency. Additionally, the Arizona Supreme Court has issued Administrative Order No. 2020-48 (replacing Administrative Order No. 2020-47) authorizing limitations of court operations during a public health emergency.

Therefore, there is a need to temporarily amend numbered paragraph 14 of Amended Administrative Order 2019-1 *Disposition of Civil Offenses by Court Clerks*.

IT IS ORDERED, upon request, through May 12, 2020, court clerks shall grant up to three (3), sixty (60) day extensions to complete a Defensive Driving class.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, court clerks shall set a payment plan over the phone or by email for cases that are in the following *failure to pay* disposition status:

- 50 - Failure to pay restricted license,
- 51 - Failure to pay suspension - criminal cases only,
- 54 - Failure to appear/comply NRVC (out of state D/L) - civil cases only,
- 55 - Failure to pay suspension - civil cases only,
- 57 - Failure to pay - criminal cases that are not deemed moving violations
- 58 - Failure to appear suspension - civil case only.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, that upon the setting of a payment plan referred to in the above paragraph, court clerks shall provide defendants with a court abstract directing the Arizona Motor Vehicle Division (MVD) to lift the relevant suspension or restriction upon their driving privilege.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, defendants requesting other relief for the above-referenced failure to pay disposition status shall be directed to walk-in court.

Unless otherwise amended, this order will expire on May 12, 2020.
