**ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER NO. 2020-002**

**IN RE: LIMITING COURT PARTICIPANTS DURING PUBLIC HEALTH  
EMERGENCY**

---

WHEREAS, the Governor of the State of Arizona declared a statewide emergency due to concerns for the spread of the COVID-19 virus; and

WHEREAS, the Chief Justice of the Arizona Supreme Court entered Administrative Order No. 2020-47 intended to limit in-person contacts in Arizona courts to the greatest extent possible consistent with core constitutional rights.

IT IS ORDERED that attendance of persons, other than court officials, at all court proceedings in Cochise County is limited to parties, attorneys, victims, witnesses, jurors, one parent of a juvenile defendant, and jail personnel until further order of this presiding judge.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that, to the greatest extent possible, judges shall not permit greater than ten (10) persons, other than court officials and/or jurors, at the same time in any individual, separable room within the courthouse.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the judge assigned to a particular case may allow other persons to attend a hearing or gather within an area under extraordinary circumstances.
