

## **COURT PERSONNEL**

### **Statewide Narrative Summary**

The statewide summary reflects all court positions as of June 30, 2013, including positions funded from both primary and non-primary budget sources. The information was reported by the individual courts and probation departments in response to the Supreme Court personnel survey distributed electronically in June 2013.

The total number of persons working full-time in the Arizona judicial system increased from 9,363 in FY 2012 to 9,426 in FY 2013, a 0.7% increase. The courts employed an additional 1,008 part-time personnel, down 2.4% from 1,033 in FY 2012.

The most notable increase in personnel occurred in the “Deputy Clerk” position, which increased by 30 positions from 2,152 in FY 2012 to 2,182 in FY 2013. Vacant positions which were first reported in FY 2012, decreased by 66 positions or 9.4% from last fiscal year.

The courts also had the services of 2,456 regular volunteers, an increase of 5.2% from the 2,335 in FY 2012. Volunteers include attorneys, court reporters, teachers, mediators, information desk personnel, Court Appointed Special Advocates, Foster Care Review Board members, and other professionals and non-professionals who serve as on-call magistrates.

Additionally, the courts utilized 171,876 hours of temporary personnel assistance. This is equivalent to 21,485 person-days, or 83 full-time employees (at 260 working days per year).

Some of the FY 2012 figures may not correspond to figures published in last year's Data Report due to corrected information received subsequent to publication of the Report. Personnel reports received from courts are checked for anomalies, but are not audited by the Supreme Court.
