

## **COURT PERSONNEL**

### **Statewide Narrative Summary**

The statewide summary reflects all court positions as of June 30, 2014, including positions funded from both primary and non-primary budget sources. The information was reported by the individual courts and probation departments in response to the Supreme Court personnel survey distributed electronically in June 2014.

The total number of persons working full-time in the Arizona judicial system decreased from 9,426 in FY 2013 to 9,320 in FY 2014, a decrease of 1.1%. The courts employed an additional 1,038 part-time personnel, up 2.3% from 1,015 in FY 2013.

The most notable changes in personnel occurred in the “Deputy Clerk” position which decreased by 89 full time positions or 4.1%, and the “Program Support Staff” which decreased by 23 positions or 23.7%. The most notable personnel increases were seen in the “Court Administrator” category with 10 new positions and the “Other Surveillance” category with 19 new positions. Of the total funded positions statewide, 7.0% of full time and 18.2% of part time positions were reported as vacant at the end of FY 2014.

The courts also had the services of 2,741 regular volunteers, an increase of 11.6% from the 2,456 in FY 2013. Volunteers include attorneys, court reporters, teachers, mediators, information desk personnel, Court Appointed Special Advocates, Foster Care Review Board members, and other professionals and non-professionals who serve as on-call magistrates.

Additionally, the courts utilized 182,618 hours of temporary personnel assistance. This is equivalent to 22,827 person-days, or 91 full-time employees (at 252 working days per year during FY 2014).

Some of the FY 2013 figures may not correspond to figures published in last year's Data Report due to corrected information received subsequent to publication of the Report. Personnel reports received from courts are checked for anomalies, but are not audited by the Supreme Court.
