

## **COURT PERSONNEL**

### **Statewide Narrative Summary**

The statewide summary reflects all court positions as of June 30, 2017, including positions funded from both primary and non-primary budget sources. The information was reported by the individual courts and probation departments in response to the Supreme Court personnel survey distributed electronically in June 2017.

The total number of persons working full-time in the Arizona judicial system increased 1.6% from 9,241 in FY 2016, to 9,391 in FY 2017. The courts employed an additional 998 part-time personnel, down 5.2% from 1,053 in FY 2016.

During FY 2017, two additional justices were added to the Supreme Court bench, increasing the total from 5 to 7 justices. Other notable personnel changes include 52 additional field probation officers, and 70 additional program and general full time support staff. Detention officers positions were reduced from 482 to 447, and probation/detention administrative staff positions were also reduced from 174 to 145 (-16.7%). Of the total funded positions statewide, 7.5% of full time and 17.5% of part time positions were reported as vacant at the end of FY 2017. Of the part time positions, 315 or 31.6%, are classified as Judicial or Other Magisterial.

The courts also had the services of 3,382 regular volunteers, an increase from the 2,312 volunteers during FY 2016. Volunteers include attorneys, court reporters, teachers, mediators, information desk personnel, Court Appointed Special Advocates, Foster Care Review Board members, and other professionals and non-professionals who serve as on-call magistrates.

Additionally, the courts utilized 92,752 hours of temporary personnel assistance. This is equivalent to 11,594 person-days, or 45 full-time employees.

Some of the FY 2016 figures may not correspond to figures published in last year's Data Report due to corrected information received subsequent to publication of the Report. Personnel reports received from courts are checked for anomalies, but are not audited by the Supreme Court.
