The commission reviewed the complaint filed in this matter and determined that the judge did not knowingly violate the ethical canons. Although the ruling was four days outside the mandatory time limit, the delay was insignificant in light of the judge's remorse and her implementation of a new system designed to ensure that all matters will be ruled on promptly in the future. Accordingly, the commission voted to dismiss the case pursuant to Rules 16(a) and 23(a).
