COMPLAINT AGAINST A JUDGE

Judge  violated the judicial code of conduct in the following manner:

1. Judge  failed to uphold the integrity and independence of judiciary, in that he was disrespectful and demonstrated disinterest in my case, by interrupting my court hearing to judge an employment case and perform a marriage ceremony.
2. Judge  showed impropriety in the performance his duties, by half-heartedly "listening to the testimony given in my case". His clerk was standing at his side while he was signing unrelated documents and not paying attention to the testimony being given.
3. Judge  exhibited partiality and lack of diligence in adjudicating my case, which was filed by an ex-boy, who sued me for the cost of a car, which he purchased for me in an attempt to redeem our relationship. Despite the plaintiff's admission, under oath, that he **FORGED my signature on a power of attorney to the seller**, Judge  awarded  \$6,700 for the cost of the car.
4. Judge  extra-judicial activities compromised his judicial obligations and cost me extra court time. My case began at 1pm and continued until after 7pm, I was ordered to pay the court time for the plaintiff, as well. Clearly, the court costs were extensive due to the judge's "extra-judicial activities".
5. Judge  demonstrated professional bias and personal prejudice in his judgment. As the only Black Woman in the courtroom I felt at a total disadvantage and that there was contempt for me.

I am a 65-year-old widow; resident of  and the travel to Arizona to defend myself has caused great hardship financially, physically and emotionally. To add insult to injury, the plaintiff has subsequently retrieved the car, but is pursuing garnishing of my income. I am hereby, requesting a full investigation and appropriate action be taken.
