I went to the Court for the hearing for My attorney, had told me he was surprised the case had been accepted by Judge and should have been heard in Court. When the hearing started the judge stated she had pretty much made up her mind before, but wanted to see if I brought any new witnesses with me. We did have evidence to submit but the judge ruled for the plaintiff on a legal technicality. No testimony was allowed to be given, when questioned the judge and tried to defend our position to let the case be heard, Judge made several references to statements I had allegedly made, not in court, which indicates to me she had discussed the case with the plaintiff, or someone associated with the plaintiff.

After the hearing, I was told by that Judge never awards attorney's fees, even if the defendants don't show up for court. She did, however, award attorney's fees in this case in an exorbitant amount.

I feel contributing factors in this case are the fact that two of my relatives have ran against her for the position of and the judge is close friends with parties associated with the plaintiff, namely

The testimony I was not allowed to present referred directly to is an employee of the plaintiff. I feel the judicial power in this case has been misused, either in retaliation or as a favor to a friend.
