On May 29, 2007 Judge _____ made a false statement regarding my appearance in court. The false statement was not provided to me until a private attorney requested the transcript over one year later. I remained in custody and denied release from custody because _____ was not truthful in court. I have provided in this complaint a copy of the transcript, a letter from the Public Defender and a motion to Quash Bench Warrant and Reset for Trial, an order to vacate current trial date of May 29, 2007.

The transcript for May 29, 2007 supports my complaint that the judge was aware that on May 24, 2007 the trial date was vacated. The letter from Attorney _____ on April 18, 2007 addresses the purposeful steps made by the court; to disregard that the courts were aware that court dates had been changed prior to the arrest warrant being issued. The motion to quash the bench warrant on June 6, 2007 further supports my claim that the judge, _____, was 100% aware that I did not miss any trial date or court date to that matter. I was extradited and kept in jail for over 1 year. I have also enclosed the two previous complaints that were not investigated.
