ORDER

The commission received information regarding an ad the judge placed in a local newspaper promoting her legal services and referencing her status as a pro tem judge. After considering the judge's response, the commission concluded that she did not violate the Code of Judicial Conduct but should have been aware of Opinion 03-06, which prohibits judges from lending the prestige of judicial office to advance private interests. The complaint was resolved with an advisory comment reminding the judge of her obligation to be aware of and comply with the provisions of judicial ethics opinions as well as the Code of Judicial Conduct. The complaint is dismissed pursuant to Rule 16(a) and 23.
