Dear Judicial board,

The web site link to submit the complaint form was not working, so I am writing my complaint in the form of an email. I have also copied my attorney Zubair Aslamy on this complaint.

Unfortunately, I have huge concerns about this process. Upon review of historical rulings it is evident that this panel rules overwhelmingly if not consistently in favor of the judicial staff. This, in my opinion is the nucleus of a broken system.

My last hearing on December 14th for divorce case # FC2008- is indicative of a broken system filled with bias and negligence. Decisions are being levied with little to no regards to the consequences of all parties and minor children. Myself and my attorney presented tangible evidence showing a 30%+ change in income differential and a solid argument as to why father should be responsible for day care expenses and no longer required to take UAT's when no prior evidence was ever submitted to support the testing requirements. The child support currently being paid even exceeds the state algorithm based on 2008 calculations, much less calculation based on today's financials. In spite of that evidence, Judge denied our motions even after taking up to 30 days to make the ruling!

It is clearly evident that Judge and judge are equipped with a RUBBER STAMP and ALL rulings in this outlandish judicial mockery have gone against me (the petitioner).

I petitioned for a divorce because I was in a relationship with a controlling, money hungry, alcoholic and this justice system did everything to support her desires and cause me undo financial stress and missed parenting opportunities with my 4 year old little angel.

The ruling based on the December 14th hearing was so negligent that I simply ask for the following:

1. A NEW judge and a FAIR trial. Judge was the same judge that rubber stamped the denials surrounding the December 14th hearing requesting child support modifications that also ruled against our motion to set aside decree in Q4/2009. There was overwhelming evidence submitted in that motion to show that there was coercion on the part of ADR Michael Shew and my attorney. Other evidence was also clearly disregarded. Obviously Judge applied the same due diligence to that motion as he did for the December 14th motions.
2. Reversal of ALL decisions made surrounding the December 14th ruling and approval to set aside motion of decree in this case, so I have my ONE DAY IN COURT.
3. Financial reimbursement for attorney fees. I have spent over \$130,000.00 in attorney fees. This was a two year marriage with one child and has turned into a made for TV movie. As a matter of fact ABC is doing a segment based on my story.

In conclusion, judge and Judge have gone out of their way to rule against me as the MALE petitioner in this campaign. This has been a mockery of justice! The state of Arizona required that I take parenting classes, which strongly supports parenting involvement from both parties and this court has done everything it can to keep me from co-parenting my daughter. All this, in spite of multiple pleas and evidence supporting compliance to the best of my abilities have yielded unfair results.

I deserve justice and I don't deserve to be rubber stamped and treated like a criminal!!!
