Apparently it was originally filed in 2008 when

March 2010. Somehow the date didn't stand
out to the court clerk or the judge. I don't
even know who this debt is owed to and when
I called the attorney's office Friday April 23, 2010
at 5:30 PM - 15 minutes after being served the
papers I was asked for my Social Security number
over the phone to verify that it is my debt.
I told them they must be nuts. I'm not surprised
that an attorney in this state tried to pull this, but
the judge should have noticed this back in 2008
