ORDER

The complainant alleged that a justice of the peace glared at her and used a hostile tone when addressing her. After carefully considering the complaint, the commission found insufficient evidence of misconduct to justify further investigation. The allegations rest solely on a subjective interpretation of the judge's vocal tone and facial expressions with no allegations that the judge said anything improper. Accordingly, the complaint is dismissed pursuant to Rules 16(a) and 23.
