ORDER

The complainant observed a court and alleged that a justice of the peace violated the rights of several inmates by improperly ordering them to face the wall when they entered to the courtroom. The complainant believed this was improper because Americans have the right to face the American flag. The commission reviewed the matter and found no evidence of ethical misconduct on the part of the judge. Accordingly, the complaint is dismissed pursuant to Rules 16(a) and 23.

To Whomever it may concern:

Thank you for much needed input regarding Judge Clyde Andrews, who's suddenly retiring. Had I known such a remedy existed in 2004, I had records of personal malfeasance on his part. He wouldn't appoint a public defender nor would he allow me to represent myself. He told me, "NOT in his court, I wasn't Perry Mason, nor did I possess the knowledge & education of the court's." (Ultimately, the entire spurious case was completely dismissed after 10 agonizing months.)

However, I wish to bring another local judge to your attention. Judge practices improper behavior with prisoners in jumpsuits & arrestees in street attire the moment they're filed into court. Though none were disruptive, as an attendee in open court, on two occasions I witnessed her barking an order for "all to face the wall without touching it."

I firmly believe Americans have an absolute right to face the American flag symbolizing rights, liberty, & justice for all. Walls are no substitute.

Further anyone in attendance could potentially be selected for jury duty thereby by tainting the possibility of a fair trial with impartial jurists.

I sincerely hope you forge ahead with the "clean-up" & perhaps overhaul. A "silent shagger" could be well-utilized in this circumstance.

It's past time proper procedure & dignity of court decorum be re-established & installed.
