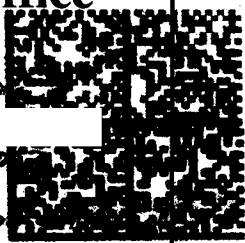
To: COMMISSION ON Judicial Conduct,
