ORDER

The complainant alleged that a municipal court judge prematurely and improperly issued an arrest warrant despite his “involuntary absence and requests for a continuance.” The commission reviewed the complaint and found no evidence of ethical misconduct on the part of the judge. The judge’s decision to deny a continuance and issue a warrant is a legal issue outside the jurisdiction of the commission. Accordingly, the complaint is dismissed in its entirety pursuant to Rules 16(a) and 23.
