The complainant alleged that a superior court judge failed to rule on a motion for his attorney to withdraw, which left him without counsel. When the judge received information from the complainant about the issue, she immediately granted the motion. Accordingly, the complaint is dismissed in its entirety pursuant to Rules 16(a) and 23.
