The complainant alleged that a superior court judge sabotaged his post-conviction relief process by finding that his request was improper and by refusing to rule on his motion for a rehearing. The commission reviewed the complaint and the supplemental information provided by the complainant, along with the online docket, and found no evidence of ethical misconduct on the part of the judge. The issues raised involve legal matters that are outside the jurisdiction of the commission. Accordingly, the complaint is dismissed in its entirety pursuant to Rules 16(a) and 23.
