ORDER

The complainant alleged that a superior court commissioner improperly delayed ruling on a motion for temporary spousal support. After reviewing the allegations and the case history, the commission found no evidence of ethical misconduct on the part of the judge. The court record revealed that an under advisement ruling was made on the matter within the required time. Accordingly, the complaint is dismissed in its entirety pursuant to Rules 16(a) and 23.

After the hearing [redacted] was in a vehicle accident on the 20th of May. William has stopped depositing his pay checks in family checking accts, giving her a fraction of his monthly earnings with no access to his earnings. I'm still stranded from my accident, having no experience or knowledge of how to deal with this kind of stuff + with William staying in the house + having scared me to the point where I felt I had to live Tucson. My attorney knows my situation and is trying to save me money because I've been a housewife for 34 yrs and have none and if the judge rules in Williams favor, I'll wind up with nothing. But it should be 50/50 at least and it should have happened way before now. JUST MY OPINION.
