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**ORDER**

The complainant alleged that a municipal court judge denied him an opportunity to be heard.

The responsibility of the Commission on Judicial Conduct is to impartially determine if the judge engaged in conduct that violated the Code of Judicial Conduct and, if so, to take appropriate disciplinary action. The purpose and authority of the commission is limited to this mission.

After thoroughly reviewing all of the information provided by the complainant and the judge's response, the members of the commission found no evidence of ethical misconduct and concluded that the judge did not violate the Code in this case. Accordingly, the complaint is dismissed in its entirety pursuant to Rules 16(a) and 23.

I was set to appear before Judge \_\_\_\_\_ on July 13, 2011. I was five minutes late for court. As I stood in line to sign in, it was 10 minutes after my scheduled appearance time by the time I signed in.

I informed the receptionist that I have a medical disability that prevented me from being ontime. The receptionist stated that she would talk to the Judge and see if he would talk to me.

I waited for over an hour. The Judge was done with court and had NO cases before him. He refused to allow me to talk with him about my disability.

Medically I needed more time to make it to my appointment. I was only slightly late and was not afforded the opportunity to be heard. I was ruled against since I was not there.

Please advise this Judge that people with medical problems ~~to~~ have the right to reasonable accommodations. An additional 10 minutes is certainly reasonable.
