I believe that on numerous occasions during proceedings in this case between the dates of September, 2010 to July, 2011 Judge _____ of the Maricopa County Superior Court violated rules outlined in the Judicial Code of Conduct, Canons 1 and 2.

I have alleged and detailed those allegations in my motion to recuse Judge _____ filed with the Superior Court clerk on June 30, 2011. I described ten incidents and referenced court documents and transcripts that I do believe illustrate Judge _____ unfairness, lack of partiality, bias, conflict of interest, manifest and fundamental error, capricious mistakes, prejudice, ex-parte collusion, judicial misconduct, impropriety, self interest and/or abuses of discretion committed against me throughout the proceedings of this case.

My plan was to include the voluminous motion to recuse along with the pertinent transcripts and copies of the audio recordings along with this complaint form. Having read the instructions I see I am not permitted to attach original court documents. I assume that to mean that I should not attach copies of original court documents- as the Superior Court clerk, not I, would be in possession of the actual original documents in this ongoing case.

Since this complaint will most likely initiate an investigation I will further assume that this commission will access the filed documents it believes are necessary for it to make a decision. If this commission would prefer that I deliver copies of any pertinent documents or recordings I would be more than willing to comply.
