ORDER

The complainant alleged that a judge improperly served as presiding judge of a superior court when the judge was married to a deputy county attorney who served as a prosecutor in the same county.

The responsibility of the Commission on Judicial Conduct is to impartially determine if the judge engaged in conduct that violated the provisions of Article 6.1 of the Arizona Constitution or the Code of Judicial Conduct and, if so, to take appropriate disciplinary action. The purpose and authority of the commission is limited to this mission.

After reviewing the allegations and the judge's response, the commission found no evidence to support further investigation of any alleged ethics violations. Accordingly, the complaint is dismissed in its entirety pursuant to Rules 16(a) and 23.
