**ORDER**

The complainant alleged a superior court judge violated his right to a speedy trial and has not allowed him to obtain discovery or the assistance he needs to properly defend himself.

The responsibility of the Commission on Judicial Conduct is to impartially determine if the judge engaged in conduct that violated the provisions of Article 6.1 of the Arizona Constitution or the Code of Judicial Conduct and, if so, to take appropriate disciplinary action. The purpose and authority of the commission is limited to this mission.

After reviewing all of the information provided by the complainant and the electronic court records in the case, the commission found no evidence of ethical misconduct and concluded that the judge did not violate the Code in this case. The commission does not have jurisdiction to review the legal sufficiency of the judge's rulings. Accordingly, the complaint is dismissed in its entirety, pursuant to Rules 16(a) and 23.

You can see by the documents provided that everything has been done to prevent me from either providing a good defense or gaining my freedom. The treatment I am receiving while in custody is a continuation of what I received before I was arrested.
