ORDER

The complainant alleged a superior court judge improperly denied her requests for a continuance and/or to appear telephonically.

The responsibility of the Commission on Judicial Conduct is to impartially determine if the judge engaged in conduct that violated the provisions of Article 6.1 of the Arizona Constitution or the Code of Judicial Conduct and, if so, to take appropriate disciplinary action. The purpose and authority of the commission is limited to this mission.

After review, the commission found no evidence of ethical misconduct and concluded that the judge did not violate the Code in this case. The commission approved sending the judge an advisory letter, recommending that he rule on motions to continue and motions to appear telephonically in advance of a hearing. The complaint is dismissed pursuant to Rules 16(b) and 23(a).
