ORDER

The complainant alleged a justice of the peace improperly refused to excuse him from jury service.

The responsibility of the Commission on Judicial Conduct is to impartially determine if the judge engaged in conduct that violated the provisions of Article 6.1 of the Arizona Constitution or the Code of Judicial Conduct and, if so, to take appropriate disciplinary action. The purpose and authority of the commission is limited to this mission.

After review, the commission found no evidence of ethical misconduct and concluded that the judge did not violate the Code in this case. Accordingly, the complaint is dismissed in its entirety, pursuant to Rules 16(a) and 23.

The commission reminds the judge that it is his responsibility to cooperate fully with commission staff and the commission during all stages of its investigation of complaints regardless of their perceived lack of merit by the judge.
