### ORDER

The complainant alleged a superior court judge entered orders against a nonparty without proper notice, issued inconsistent rulings, and incorrectly applied the law.

The responsibility of the Commission on Judicial Conduct is to impartially determine if the judge engaged in conduct that violated the provisions of Article 6.1 of the Arizona Constitution or the Code of Judicial Conduct and, if so, to take appropriate disciplinary action. The purpose and authority of the commission is limited to this mission.

After review, the commission found no evidence of ethical misconduct and concluded that the judge did not violate the Code in this case. The commission approved sending the judge an advisory letter to thoroughly familiarize himself with the applicable family law rules so as not to violate Rule 1.1 (Compliance with the Law). The complaint is dismissed pursuant to Rules 16(b) and 23(a).

Commission members George Foster, Anna Mary Glaab, and J. Tyrrell Taber did not participate in the consideration of this matter.



Judge ruling on the motion to compel was not impartial in violation of Rule 2.2, otherwise he would not have had to claim that his previous order said something other than what it actually said.
Judge did not perform his duties competently in violation of Rule 2.5.

Judge predecessor entered an order purporting to grant dome of my client's to his former spouse. I filed a motion to vacate those orders. Exhibit 8. As you can see, the law could not be more clear.
