ORDER

March 15, 2022

The Complainant alleged that two superior court judges violated the law, including his right to be heard, and they were not impartial.

The role of the Commission on Judicial Conduct is to impartially determine whether a judicial officer has engaged in conduct that violates the Arizona Code of Judicial Conduct or Article 6.1 of the Arizona Constitution. There must be clear and convincing evidence of such a violation in order for the Commission to take disciplinary action against a judicial officer.

The Commission does not have jurisdiction to overturn, amend, or remand a judicial officer's legal rulings. The Commission reviewed all relevant available information and concluded there was not clear and convincing evidence of ethical misconduct in this matter. The complaint is therefore dismissed pursuant to Commission Rules 16(a) and 23(a).

Commission members Denise K. Aguilar, Roger D. Barton, Barbara Brown, and Louis Frank Dominguez did not participate in the consideration of this matter.

Dear commission,

On [redacted] I sent a petition to modify visitation, parenting time, and also disclosed there being suicidal ideations amongst my children pursuant to A.R.S. 25-411(A).

Judge [redacted] failed to inquire or follow A.R.S. 25-403 (best interest of children findings) and proceeded to dismiss the case due to timing. Judge [redacted] failed our family, and failed to follow the law.

I then sent the petition again, stressing the importance of my childrens emotional health, disclosed many issues as well as errors. This time Judge [redacted] set an BMC, Resolution Management conference, for [redacted] @ [redacted]

Judge [redacted] vacated the MMC, and has given me no response or reason why she vacated. I received no minute entries, absolutely nothing. So Judge [redacted] failed our family and also disobeyed the law.

- The courts have failed our family, I have been denied due process, I haven't been given a chance to be heard (Cruz v Garcia, 240 Ariz. 234, 377 P.3d 1028, 741 Ariz Adv. Rep. 26, 2010 Ariz. App. LEXIS 147 (Ariz. Ct. App. 2010))

- The courts have alienated me from my children (Ward v. Ward, 88 Ariz. 130, 353 P.2d 895, 1960 Ariz. LEXIS 208 (Ariz.) modified, 88 Ariz. 285, 356 P.2d 30, 1960 Ariz. LEXIS 230 (Ariz. 1960))

Please take immediate action to resolve these issues, my childrens emotional health is at risk.
