The Complainant alleged that a superior court judge violated the law.

The role of the Commission on Judicial Conduct is to impartially determine whether a judicial officer has engaged in conduct that violates the Arizona Code of Judicial Conduct or Article 6.1 of the Arizona Constitution. There must be clear and convincing evidence of such a violation in order for the Commission to take disciplinary action against a judicial officer.

The Commission does not have jurisdiction to overturn, amend, or remand a judicial officer's legal rulings. The Commission reviewed all relevant available information and concluded there was not clear and convincing evidence of ethical misconduct in this matter. The complaint is therefore dismissed pursuant to Commission Rules 16(a) and 23(a).

Commission members Christopher W. Ames and Louis Frank Dominguez did not participate in the consideration of this matter.

Judge has, and continues to violate my rights under the Arizona Constitution, Article 2, Section 2.1 and Section 4; the Arizona Rules of Court - Rule 39; the United States Constitution - 5th Amendment and the United States Supreme Court Ruling -

Violation #1: That statement, that the Probation Department must make sure that my wife is not a threat to me is ILLEGAL per the US Supreme Court Castle which states "law enforcement has no duty to protect a citizen from harm even if that citizen has an order of protection." It was a vengeful act by the P.O.s, nothing more.

Violation #2: Arizona Constitution, Article 2 Section 2.1 and the Arizona Rules of Court Rule 39. I have NEVER been informed of my wife's court dates, legal status, nothing. I have told Judge this in court. She refuses to compel her staff or the Probation Department to follow the law.

Violation #3: Arizona Constitution Article 2 Section 4 and the US Constitution 5th Amendment. By illegally forcing my wife and I to remain separated she is knowingly punishing me, the victim, both emotionally and financially as I am not only the sole means of financial support for my wife and our house but I am having to pay for a separate residence to comply with the no-contact order.

Violation #4: On many occasions I have requested that Court and / or the Probation Department provide me with Statutes or Case Law supporting their actions. Even though I have been promised said law, to date (6 months later) have yet to receive anything.

Violation #5: Judge has been informed of the unprofessional, potentially illegal manner in which the Probation Department conducts themselves. Including an audio recording of a Probation Officer telling my wife that they are trying to get us to divorce. Judge dismissed these allegations and evidence of wrongdoing with the attitude that her people are above the law and can do no wrong.

I am not asking for anything to change other than for the ILLEGAL no-contact order to be lifted so my family heal and move on with our lives.
