ORDER

The Complainant alleged a superior court commissioner did not allow her to speak and threatened her with jail during family court hearings.

The role of the Commission on Judicial Conduct is to impartially determine whether a judicial officer has engaged in conduct that violates the Arizona Code of Judicial Conduct or Article 6.1 of the Arizona Constitution. There must be clear and convincing evidence of such a violation in order for the Commission to take disciplinary action against a judicial officer.

After review, the Commission found the commissioner violated Rule 1.2 when he suggested to complainant's opposing party that he could contact law enforcement. The commissioner also told the complainant that her statements could form the basis of a future criminal complaint, which had a chilling effect on her ability to explain her side of the disputed matter to the court. While this was improper under Rule 1.2 of the Code of Judicial Conduct, the Scope Section of the Code provides that not every transgression will result in the imposition of discipline. The Commission decided, after considering all the facts and circumstances, to dismiss the Complaint pursuant to Commission Rules 16(b) and 23(a), but to issue a warning letter to the judicial officer to avoid making similar statements in the future.

Commission members Roger D. Barton, Delia R. Neal, and Christopher P. Staring did not participate in the consideration of this matter.

All that judge knew was what had told him, what kind of judge makes a decision just off of what one party has said? My phone was on speaker and I had two people that sat there and listened to him not let me speak and threaten me. Judge did not rule in fairness, he is sexist and discriminated against me because I am a woman. On we had another telephonic meeting, again with my phone on speaker because at this point I know I need someone else to hear the threats. had stated multiple times that he wanted to create a new parenting agreement with me and not enforce the current custody agreement. Judge kept repeating that he could throw me in jail if wanted him to, why would he try to provoke an unsafe situation? That is not the behavior a judge should exhibit. I would like to again point out that he is saying these things and still making threats, knowing nothing about our situation which is unfair, he told that he is closing the case without prejudice so if he wants to refile and put me in jail he will do it.
