ORDER

The Complainant alleged a superior court commissioner treated him disrespectfully and made incorrect legal rulings in a probate case.

The role of the Commission on Judicial Conduct is to impartially determine whether a judicial officer has engaged in conduct that violates the Arizona Code of Judicial Conduct or Article 6.1 of the Arizona Constitution. There must be clear and convincing evidence of such a violation in order for the Commission to take disciplinary action against a judicial officer.

The Commission does not have jurisdiction to overturn, amend, or remand a judicial officer's legal rulings. The Commission reviewed all relevant available information and concluded there was not clear and convincing evidence of ethical misconduct in this matter. The complaint is therefore dismissed pursuant to Commission Rules 16(a) and 23(a).

Commission members Denise K. Aguilar and Michael J. Brown did not participate in the consideration of this matter.

This case was originally filed by me on The first hearing was held on and presided over by Commissioner All of the relevant respondents and (for) objected to the Petition. My counsel. was ordered to prepare and deliver, on or before a Joint Proposed Form of Scheduling Order, approved by all parties as to form and content, which complies with Probate Rule 27(d) and contains a fillable paragraph with blanks for the Court to provide a date for a status conference required by Probate Rule 27(e). This was in the minute entry dated . The Order was to be physically signed by each party on a hard copy and not electronic. A division staff review of the Joint Proposed Scheduling Order was scheduled for even though I reminded My lawyer did not prepare and deliver the proposed scheduling order by her twice. She did not get signed approvals from all parties (Commissioner specified paper copies mailed to all parties) Instead my lawyer and two lawyers from the other parties filed an actual (not proposed) scheduling order which was signed only by the lawyers. It did not have blanks for the courts to provide a or date for a status conference!! **This is where Commissioner comes in. a Minute Entry was filed approving the non-complying scheduling order stating it was in On did the order. The contormance whit the Minute Entry dated Comm. Scheduling Order was NOT a Proposed Scheduling Order approved by the parties with blanks for the courts to provide a date for a status conference as ordered by Commissioner urther ordered that the parties shall participate in a mandatory settlement conference and Comm. referred the case to the Court's Alternative Dispute Resolution Department. She also ordered a Virtual Status Conference for away. virtually destroyed my Petition for Trust Accounting. The Probate Court Commissioner has not yet ordered the Trust Accountings be provided. The status conference required by Probate Rule 27(e) never got scheduled because of Commissioner nterference.

as a Court Connect hearing. I attended the hearing via

I was expecting the initial hearing to be brief and I would be given a chance to object to the Joint Petition.

Commissionel was hostile toward me from the start. She never asked me if I objected. She started interrogating me about my knowledge of the accounting that was provided in the petition. She berated me. She repeatedly insulted my intelligence. She reputed my every reply. She constantly tried to intimidate me. She even interrogated me under oath about my communications with my ex-lawyer which has lawyer-client privilege. She repeatedly gave me legal advice that I did not ask for. She was angry and condescending. Two times she ordered me to limit my reply response to the time period after my Mother's death; and then she would ask me angrily "?" She only stopped when the attorney for the respondents interrupted and told her it was OK for me to file an objection to the accounting of the prior period.

Commissioner told me I could not continue with my Petition For Trust Accounting and that she would NOT allow the Alternative Dispute Resolution process that she put my case in to continue. She told me my case was too small to bother with.

Commissioner in closing instructed me that my objection must be split into two parts with detailed specific objections to the trust accountings of the prior and successor trustees. I am only to object to the trust accountings that was provided to my ex-lawyer and the one attached to the Joint Petition.

The Probate Court has not yet approved my Petition for Trust Accounting because Commissioner blocked the legal proceedings. I have not received any Trust Accounting through the probate court.

Commissioner refused to grant me additional time to find a replacement attorney. I have been traumatized and am having trouble composing my objection and figuring out how to file it with the court in the proper format. I live in so it is especially challenging. Please help me if you can.
