ORDER

May 18, 2023

The Complainants alleged improper legal rulings by a municipal court judge hearing an injunction against harassment.

The role of the Commission on Judicial Conduct is to impartially determine whether a judicial officer has engaged in conduct that violates the Arizona Code of Judicial Conduct or Article 6.1 of the Arizona Constitution. There must be clear and convincing evidence of such a violation in order for the Commission to take disciplinary action against a judicial officer.

The Commission does not have jurisdiction to overturn, amend, or remand a judicial officer's legal rulings. The Commission reviewed all relevant available information and concluded there was not clear and convincing evidence of ethical misconduct in this matter. The complaint is therefore dismissed pursuant to Commission Rules 16(a) and 23(a).

Commission member Delia R. Neal did not participate in the consideration of this matter.

	Plaintiffs used a statement I allegedly made to them regarding my husband. Plaintiff's statement was a complete lie and I appeared in court to rebutt. We took worth of pictures to show the distance between where my husband was using his lawn tractor vs where the plaintiffs where standing, brought my to testify that plaintiff was out of control. Twice plaintiff had a meltdown, screaming and yelling at us. Even her husband could not get her to stop.
	Plaintiff filed a restraining order against my husband stating that I told her he was dangerous and had assulted them with his lawn tractor. I wanted to testify to the truth that I had told her to stop trying to get his attention, he did not want to converse with them and she should top shouting to him. The magistrate stated I would not be able to make any statements. My husband offered the pictures and she refused to look at them.
	At this point I realized that the magistrate had spoke with supervisor of land use before hearing and had already predetermined the outcome. Plantiffs are living in an illegal mobile home which we did file a complaint with land use. use has a bone to pick with us because we had a rediquious tilme getting our final permit due to outside handrails on my mother's manufactured home. Two comments he made caused me to call town manager and complain of conflict of interest and abusive language. he stated that '
	I told town manager that since he works for the people of I no longer wanted hm on my property. Town manager called me and asked if I would allow him back on the property to explain himself. I stated that he had already had a week to tell us what was wrong and failed to do it and I did not want him back on my property for any reason. was able to move into her little house.
	This magistrate made her decision based on land use not assault. She spoke to my husband las if he were a two year old that soiled his dyper. She mentioned lane use twice. I am extremely angry that we were refused our rights specified in the original complaint.
	That we could bring witnesses That we could bring evidence She was adjudicating land use not safety.
	My husband is years old and I am years old, I will never sit back and allow misuse of authority to be used against us.
