ORDER

The complainant alleged improper legal rulings by a municipal court judge hearing a petition for order of protection.

The role of the Commission on Judicial Conduct is to impartially determine whether a judicial officer has engaged in conduct that violates the Arizona Code of Judicial Conduct or Article 6.1 of the Arizona Constitution. There must be clear and convincing evidence of such a violation in order for the Commission to take disciplinary action against a judicial officer.

The Commission does not have jurisdiction to overturn, amend, or remand a judicial officer's legal rulings. The Commission reviewed all relevant available information and concluded there was not clear and convincing evidence of ethical misconduct in this matter. The complaint is therefore dismissed pursuant to Commission Rules 16(a) and 23(a).

Commission members Denise K. Aguilar, Roger D. Barton, and Michael J. Brown did not participate in the consideration of this matter.

Regarding the Arizona Code of Judicial Conduct, Cannon 1. States, "A judge shall uphold and promote the independence, integrity, and impartiality of the judiciary and shall avoid impropriety and the appearance of impropriety." It is the ethical obligation of all officers of The Court and Judiciary of Arizona to uphold and abide by the laws of the state and federal and state constitutions. Judge chose to NOT do so by issuing a warrant against a person—who has been a victim of Domestic Abuse by the Plaintiff for fifteen years, WITHOUT any credible evidence, restricting her from her child (violating the procedural rules for Orders of Protection, issued by The Arizona Supreme Court. This conduct and choice compromises the integrity of the judiciary of Arizona and the legitemacy of the Court, undermining the public confidence in the court system for and state (Rule 1.(2) 3 & 5).		
Subsequently, this judge was motioned to correct the indescretions of the court, against and refused to do so, exercising bias and prejudice against an inncent person, also decreasing the faith that this community may have in their local municipal court's integrity.
