The complainant alleged denial of due process and improper demeanor by a justice of the peace hearing an eviction case.

The role of the Commission on Judicial Conduct is to impartially determine whether a judicial officer has engaged in conduct that violates the Arizona Code of Judicial Conduct or Article 6.1 of the Arizona Constitution. There must be clear and convincing evidence of such a violation in order for the Commission to take disciplinary action against a judicial officer.

The Commission does not have jurisdiction to overturn, amend, or remand a judicial officer's legal rulings. The Commission reviewed all relevant available information and concluded there was not clear and convincing evidence of ethical misconduct in this matter. The complaint is therefore dismissed pursuant to Commission Rules 16(a) and 23(a).

Commission member Barbara Brown did not participate in the consideration of this matter.

that has caused me significant distress. I was but were awarded a judgment by taken advantage of both by my apartment complex and by a judicial system that is supposed to ensure I am heard. In a legal setting all facts should be considered, yet the judge ruled in favor of the plaintiff who blatantly lied in court without one look at the extensive documentation I had prepared in my defense. It is disheartening because I am so young and was battling the after effects of a global pandemic while living did not fulfill his obligation as a judge and his behavior is likely alone. Simply put, Judge reflective of a larger issue. I am sure I am not the first young, vulnerable, ignorant minority without the proper resources to advocate for my own defense. The entire hearing was recorded and therefore what I am saying can be corroborated. Why did the judge refuse my evidence? I have rights that were blatantly disregarded. This is an improper use of authority and suppression of evidence; evidence that would have freed me from being blacklisted as a tenant and unable to find adequate housing to date. I am extremely Precinct and need a response, review and dissapointed in the injustice that I faced in the explanation of the conduct used in court. Ethical misconduct should not be tolerated in any legal capacity and I will not rest until the judgements made against me are removed and guidance is provided to

on judicial integrity. I understand the commission cannot reverse court orders or assign a new judge to a case as aforementioned; however it is expected and appreciated if the commission directs me to the property entity to do so.
