The Complainant alleged improper legal rulings and poor demeanor by a superior court judge hearing a family case.

The role of the Commission on Judicial Conduct is to impartially determine whether a judicial officer has engaged in conduct that violates the Arizona Code of Judicial Conduct or Article 6.1 of the Arizona Constitution. There must be clear and convincing evidence of such a violation in order for the Commission to take disciplinary action against a judicial officer.

The Commission reviewed all relevant available information and concluded there was not clear and convincing evidence of ethical misconduct in this matter. The complaint is therefore dismissed pursuant to Commission Rules 16(a) and 23(a).

So I have a ongoing custody case with my ex, back in [REDACTED], I had a [REDACTED] minute long hearing for temporary orders that my ex filed. I had submitted evidence in time for my hearing but [REDACTED] would not allow my evidence to be submitted and threw it out because my ex claimed she didn't have anything from me. Also I was never even served for this hearing and furthermore based on zero evidence shown and zero exhibits being submitted by my ex [REDACTED] went ahead and let my ex immediately take our [REDACTED] year old son away from me in [REDACTED] and immediately move him to [REDACTED], this was incredibly traumatic for him. The entire reason [REDACTED] let my ex take our son away was because I didn't text my ex and tell her what school our son was going to be enrolled in for the [REDACTED] school year, I informed [REDACTED] that we had talked about it on our previous court hearings, I had even put it in previous court records (AFI to be exact) and informed [REDACTED] about how our son had told his mom numerous times about how excited he was to go to his new school. [REDACTED] didn't care and basically didn't even let me say anything. Her last word were [REDACTED] " and she walked out. I was told by an attorney that it was against the rule of law for her to not accept my evidence and that the case should have never even been opened to begin with especially considering I was never even served as well.
