**ORDER**

October 6, 2023

The Complainant alleged that a superior court commissioner failed to follow through on a threat of contempt when child support was not paid in full on date certain.

The role of the Commission on Judicial Conduct is to impartially determine whether a judicial officer has engaged in conduct that violates the Arizona Code of Judicial Conduct or Article 6.1 of the Arizona Constitution. There must be clear and convincing evidence of such a violation in order for the Commission to take disciplinary action against a judicial officer.

The Commission does not have jurisdiction to overturn, amend, or remand a judicial officer's legal rulings. The Commission reviewed all relevant available information and concluded there was not clear and convincing evidence of ethical misconduct in this matter. The complaint is therefore dismissed pursuant to Commission Rules 16(a) and 23(a).

Commission members Barbara Brown, Colleen E. Concannon, and Louis Frank Dominguez did not participate in the consideration of this matter.

My name is [REDACTED], I filed for a enforcement action on [REDACTED] in my child support case, we have had multiple court dates no resolution. On [REDACTED] judge [REDACTED] hand down a specific order to defendant [REDACTED] requiring him to provide employment search documents and to make full payments of support for [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] and if he failed to comply she would issue a arrest warrant in hearing [REDACTED] @ [REDACTED]. Judge [REDACTED] did not follow through with any contempt or any enforcement action she also ordered him to pay [REDACTED] by [REDACTED] and as of today that also has not been done.

I have provided the courts with [REDACTED] years of bank statements for defendant and have established that he is working for a friend and is getting paid under the table for sole purpose of evading child support. He has been depositing significant amounts of money into his bank and there is no justifiable reason that he cannot pay support and I feel that Judge [REDACTED] has been discriminatory against me in enforcing and following thru with consequences she has ordered, which has led to defendant in recorded conversations acknowledging that he doesn't have to pay because judge is not going to do anything and so far that seems to be true.
