ALTERNATIVE DELIVERY METHOD DEFENSIVE DRIVING SCHOOLS; PROCEDURES FOR TRACKING OF STUDENT PARTICIPATION TIME

Administrative Directive No. 2010 - 10

Arizona Code of Judicial Administration (ACJA) § 7-201(D)(2)(a), as adopted by Administrative Order No. 2007-103, orders the Administrative Director of the Administrative Office of the Courts (AOC) to adopt policies and procedures for the implementation of laws pertaining to the Defensive Driving Program, and in conformity with ACJA § 7-205: Defensive Driving.

ACJA § 7-205(E)(1)(k) and (F)(25)(c)(3) requires the school to ensure a student's participation in a defensive driving course does not exceed the statutory maximum instructional time of 4.5 hours, in compliance with ARS § 28-3395. Currently, a number of certified defensive driving schools offer the course through alternative delivery methods ("ADM"), (via the Internet) and allow students to complete the course in segments, logging in and out of the course. ACJA § 7-205(F)(25)(d)(5)(h) requires the school maintain an electronic record of each student's participation in the defensive driving course, including the student's log-in and log-out times. Therefore, after due consideration,

IT IS DIRECTED the administrative, operational and financial procedure manuals of defensive driving schools shall include the provision a student may log on and off an ADM course at will, provided the school complies with all provisions of ACJA § 7-205, including the statutory maximum time period for participation in the course.
